# Resurrection Reality Christ Has Not Left Us Alone

Jesus told his disciples that, though he was going to ascend into heaven, he wasn't going to leave them alone. He was going to send "the Advocate," a title for the Holy Spirit. But Jesus wasn't sending the Spirit just to keep us company. Jesus would have the Advocate give us spiritual power so that we might participate in Christ's saving work.

Here is the final resurrection reality. The Spirit gives us the ability to raise the spiritually dead to life. We see this happen on Pentecost. The festival of Pentecost was held fifty days after the Passover. (Pentecost is Greek for "fifty.") It was a time to thank God for the harvest. But on that day, through the Church at work, the Holy Spirit gathered another harvest, a harvest of souls.

Proof of the Spirit's work is evident in our Confirmation service today. Two young 8<sup>th</sup> graders will confess the faith planted in their hearts by the Spirit at their baptism. The rest of us will remember the Spirit's work in our own lives and praise God for his grace.

FIRST LESSON Acts 2:1-21 (EHV)

The Day of Pentecost was the fulfillment of God's promise to pour out his Spirit.

When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. <sup>2</sup> Suddenly a sound like the rushing of a violent wind came from heaven, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. <sup>3</sup> They saw divided tongues that were like fire resting on each one of them. <sup>4</sup> They were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, since the Spirit was giving them the ability to speak fluently.

<sup>5</sup> Now there were godly Jewish men from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. <sup>6</sup> When this sound was heard, a crowd came together and was confused, because each one heard them speaking in his own language. <sup>7</sup> They were completely baffled and said to each other, "Look, are not all these men who are speaking Galileans? <sup>8</sup> Then how is it that each of us hears them speaking in his own native language? <sup>9</sup> Parthians, Medes, and Elamites; residents of Mesopotamia, and of Judea, Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, <sup>10</sup> Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt, and the parts of Libya around Cyrene; visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes; <sup>11</sup> Cretans and Arabs—we hear them declaring in our own languages the wonderful works of God." <sup>12</sup> They were all amazed and perplexed. They kept saying to one another, "What does this mean?" <sup>13</sup> But others mocked them and said, "They are full of new wine." <sup>14</sup> Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice, and spoke loudly and clearly to them: "Men of Judea, and all you residents of Jerusalem, understand this, and listen closely to my words. <sup>15</sup> These men are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only the third hour of the day. <sup>16</sup> On the contrary, this is what was spoken by the prophet Joel:

<sup>17</sup> This is what God says will happen in the last days:

I will pour out my Spirit on all flesh. Your sons and your daughters will prophesy.

Your young men will see visions. Your old men will dream dreams.

<sup>18</sup> Even on my servants, both men and women,

I will pour out my Spirit in those days, and they will prophesy.

<sup>19</sup>I will show wonders in the sky above, and signs on the earth below,

blood and fire and a rising cloud of smoke.

<sup>20</sup> The sun will be turned to darkness and the moon to blood before the coming of the great and glorious day of the Lord.

<sup>21</sup> And this will happen: Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.

#### **CONFIRMATION ESSAYS**

#### What comfort do we gain from the Means of Grace?

The Means of Grace is the gospel in Word and sacraments. The gospel brings us to faith in Jesus as our Savior and should comfort us every day with the assurance that our sins are forgiven because of Jesus' sacrifice; we learn more about this in Romans 10:17 where it says "Faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word about Christ". There are two sacraments,

Baptism and Holy Communion. Baptism is not just plain water, but water used by God's command and connected with God's Word, Acts 2:38 says "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit."

Holy Communion is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine, instituted by Christ for us Christians to eat and drink; it says this in Mark 14:22-24 "While they were eating, Jesus took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to his disciples saying, 'Take it; this is my body.' Then he took a cup, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and they all drank from it. He said to them 'This is my blood of the new covenant, which is poured out for many".

These sacraments fuel our faith tremendously, Baptism fuels our faith because when you are baptized the Word that is with the water creates faith and also strengthens faith, and without faith we cannot be saved it Ephesians 2:8,9 says It is by grace that you are saved, through faith and it's not from yourself but a gift from God and keeping on this point John 3:3-5 says "Jesus replied 'Very truly I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God unless they are born again.' "How can someone be born again when they are old? Nicodemous asked," Jesus answered, 'Very truly I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God unless they are born of water and the Spirit."

Holy Communion fuels our faith because the body and blood are connected with the bread and the wine, which spiritually nourishes us. Faith leads us to find God in the Bible and reach out to him in prayer for as it says in Jeremiah 29:12,13 "Then you will call on me and come and pray to me, and I will listen to you. You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart". We gain comfort from all of these parts of the Means of Grace because they create and strengthen our faith.

# Why is it so Important to Keep on Studying the Bible and to Know its Teachings, even after Confirmation?



If the people you hang out with are doing ungodly things, chances are you will do the same things they do. 2 Timothy 2:16 says "Avoid godless chatter, because those who indulge in it will become more and more ungodly". God's word always directs us in the right path. If you're going through a hard part in your life you should go to the Bible to help you get through it. Then if you see someone else going through a hard time you can use the same Bible verses you used, on them to help. In conclusion, reading and studying the Bible is essential for our growth as Christians. It's through the Bible that we learn about God's Word and his love for us, and how we are to live our daily lives. 

SERMON Ezekiel 37:1-14

The hand of the LORD was upon me. He brought me out by the Spirit of the LORD and set me down in the middle of a valley, which was full of bones. <sup>2</sup> He had me pass through them and go all over among them. There were very many on the valley floor, and they were very dry.

<sup>3</sup> He said to me, "Son of man, can these dry bones live?" I answered, "LORD God, you know." <sup>4</sup> Then he said to me, "Prophesy to these bones and say to them, 'Dry bones, hear the word of the LORD."

<sup>5</sup> This is what the LORD God says to these bones.

I am about to make breath enter you so that you will live. <sup>6</sup> I will attach tendons to you. I will put flesh back on you. I will cover you with skin and put breath in you, and you will live. Then you will know that I am the LORD.

<sup>7</sup> So I prophesied as I had been commanded, and as I was prophesying there was a noise, a rattling, as the bones came together, one bone connecting to another. <sup>8</sup> As I watched, tendons were attached to them, then flesh grew over them, and skin covered them. <sup>9</sup> Then he said to me, "Prophesy to the wind. Prophesy, son of man, and say to the wind that this is what the LORD God says. From the four winds, come, O wind, and breathe into these slain so that they may live."

<sup>10</sup> So I prophesied as he commanded me. Breath entered them, and they came back to life. They stood

on their feet, a very, very large army.

<sup>11</sup> Then he said to me, "Son of man, these bones are the whole house of Israel. They are saying, 'Our bones are dried up. Our hope is lost. We have been completely cut off.' <sup>12</sup> Therefore, prophesy and say to them that this is what the Lord God says. My people, I am going to open your graves and raise you up from your graves and bring you back to the soil of Israel. <sup>13</sup> Then you will know that I am the Lord, when I open your graves and raise you up from your graves, O my people. <sup>14</sup> I will put my Spirit in you, and you will live. I will settle you on your own land, and you will know that I, the Lord, have spoken, and I have done it, declares the Lord."


#### THE SACRAMENT


